We are in receipt of your application for the admission of Adalene A. Hawley to one of the state hospitals for the insane.

I return you herewith your financial statement in so much as it gives no information whatever. We are informed through another source that these people are well to do and therefore assume that they could not be a patient. I therefore enclose you herewith a form which we will have you to have the husband execute and send the same and the new financial statement along with the patient to the hospital. The cost of caring a person in the hospital is only \$3 a week. I have instructed the superintendent to admit this patient if accompanied by a good and proper financial statement listing the property, real, personal and other, belonging to either the patient or her husband.

I am a graduate of an incorporated medical college, and have been a legally practicing physician for more than three years in said state; I have with care and diligence prosecuted an examination, within five days prior to the date of this certificate, the same brought to us on that date, namely, on the *27* day of *March*, 190*6*, a resident of *Anderson County*, State of *Kansas*, County, and as a result of such examination find, and hereby certify to the fact, that said *Adeline A. Hawley* is insane, and a proper person for care and treatment in some institution for the insane as an insane person, under the provisions of the statutes.
